














Us

The work plan


- To clean the Jheel before the onset of monsoon.
- To make residents aware of the importance of such a large water body in their neighbourhood.
- To ensure sustained cleanliness of the Jheel post cleaning.
- Demarking the Jheel boundary to restrict further illegal encroachments in future.

HOW WE DID IT

- Cleaning started on 2.4.2012.
- More than 1200 labour days utilized so far.
- A JCB used for continious 24 days.
- The hyacinth cover is completely cleared and cleaned.
- More than 60 truck loads of waste material disposed off maintaining the KMC guidelines.
- 0.33 acres of illegal encroachment has been reclaimed.
- A highlandcreated due to sedimentation of waste material had divided the Jheelinto two parts. A channelhas beendug to connect these two parts through the high land.
- The process of demarcation of the Jheel has begun.
